Hunterdon Land Trust Farmers' Market to Host Artisan Sunday

RARITAN TOWNSHIP -- Check out the works of some of this area's finest artisans and participate in a photography workshop at the Sept. 10 Hunterdon Land Trust Farmers' Market.

Bring your camera for a workshop at 10 a.m. with professional photographer Dwight Hiscano, who will show you how to get the most out of your camera in the great outdoors.

Learn the best way to find and approach your subject, and how to use varying light and weather conditions to your advantage. Also, Hiscano will offer tips on making the best use of any photographic equipment and how composition can turn a snapshot into a work of art.

The workshop begins at the Dvoor Farm wagon house, then participants will explore the farm. The Dvoor Farm is located at 111 Mine St. in Raritan Township.

HLT's Artisan Sunday event will also feature Seeds to Sew, a Hopewell-based nonprofit, that will sell an assortment of products made in Kenya by its program participants including enkiteng bags (eco-friendly cloth gift-wrapping bags), knapsacks, beaded bracelets and kiondo baskets (made of sisal rope and recycle plastic). Seeds to Sew works to provide educational and economic opportunities for women and girls in compromised areas in the developing world.

We'll also have several artisans with their work available for purchase including: painter Pam LaFevre, wood worker Jack Garanzini, photographer Manju Malik and potter John Fulwood.

Also, Pete Tucker, a lifelong Hunterdon County resident, will sign copies of his book, *Memoirs of a Jersey Farm Boy*. Tucker has penned an entertaining collection of tales of his days as a farm boy milking cows, slopping hogs, collecting eggs and hoeing his family's enormous garden.

The HLT Farmers' Market, open from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m., features more than 20 local farmers and vendors offering organic produce, pork, chicken, yak, honey, artisan breads, freshly ground spices and loose teas, fresh-cut flowers, cheese, milk, eggs, locally roasted coffee, native plants and more. Visitors can enjoy a flatbread pizza made with ingredients provided by local farmers while listening to live music.

Prior to the market's opening, certified instructor Lauren Theis will lead a yoga session in the Dvoor Farm wagon house at 8 a.m. Cost is \$12; participants should bring their own yoga mat.
